

PETE BROWN

IT ALL DEPENDS ON YOU 1312

I MAY BE WRONG Once Upon A Time some musicians made a record in which they actually sounded like they enjoyed doing same. This is one of those all too rare records. It jells just that way. Pete's raspy alto jumps from start to finish, no matter if he's soloing or just noodling in the back-ground. Joe Thomas' crystal clear horn packs plenty of punch and his timing and phrasing are marvellous. Canadian born Ken Keisey's paino has a nice easy going style that fits in well with the loose atmosphere. Except for a solo apiece on the "B" side, Milt Hinton and J. C. Heard keep to the rear and therefore lay down a much steadier beat. All in all two very good sides that hold plenty of kicks for the collector's of "Le Jazz Hot".

IRVING FAZOLA

SWEET LORRAINE 624 CLARINET MARMALADE

New Orleans home boy Irving upsets the apple-cart by playing Sweet Lorraine with a complete set of un-New Orleanian ideas. His absence from the big time during the past few years has done him no harm and if any thing, he is more fluid than before. Surprisingly enough Marmalade came out with the clarinet getting a fair chunk of the wax. And when that clarinet is in the able hands of "Faz" it means only one thing. A good record. He is a true master of his instrument and on these sides he shows why. GEORGE HARTMAN

HINDUSTAN 627 ANGRY

"Basin Street" got together with the "Village" at this particular session when Hartman, who combines the drive of Davison and the phrasing of Clayton and Thomas in his playing, and "Buji" Centobie who shows he is no ordinary "bird" on the clarinet met the habitants of Nicks. Vernon Brown veteran trombonist gets off with some lusty "Dixieland", while Froeba indulges in some humourous "eighty-eight" work. Brown's kicking tram draws first blood on the "B" side. Following are spots for Centobie, Hartman and Froeba. Hartman to our way of thinking is the most powerful horn man to come along since "Wild Bill" Davison galloped out of the West.

J. C. HEARD ALL MY LIFE 623

> GROOVIN WITH J. C. Appearances are certainly deceiving. Believe it or not J. C. doesn't take a solo or any resemblance to one on either side. Life is practically all Buck Clayton and "Flip" Phillips. The ex-Basie trumpeter has three solos, the Herman tenorman has two, and plays obligato to two of Clayton's. A switch about on the "Groove" side has Guarnieri and Hinton tossing the theme back and forth for the first half while Clayton and Phillips take care of the rest of the record. Pleasant restrained Jazz is the best description.

THE KEYNOTERS I'M IN THE MARKET FOR YOU 1313

YOU'RE DRIVING ME CRAZY
Two trumpets, tenor, and three rhythm is the makeup for this combo. Solos being fairly even in division between the three horns and piano. Charlie Shavers and Jonah Jones are the trumpeters and they do the opening on Crazy Jones then takes it alone playing muted. Johnny Johnny Guarieri, Bud Johnson's Tenor and Shavers complete the solos. Market has another muted solo by Jones which sounds like it was originally written for a trombone. What Shavers lacks in taste he makes up for in technique and lung power as evident in both the opening and closing bars of this side.

TED NASH

628 I'VE GOT A POCKETFUL OF DREAMS THE GIRL IN MY DREAMS TRIES TO LOOK LIKE YOU

Les Brown sideman Nash and Jeff Clarkson show up best on this disc. Nash is extremely tasteful, complete even to an unobtrusive backing behind Marie Bryant's vocal. He uses a somewhat drowsy tone on the reverse that sounds like neither Webster or Young. He has one of the most original styles of any of the young tenormen of to-day.

RED NORVO

AND HIS ALL STAR SEXTET

AARON SACHS (CLARINET), RED NORVO (VIBRAHARP AND XYLO-PHONE), TEDDY WILSON (PIANO), REMO PALMIERI (GUITAR), SLAM STEWART (BASS), EDDIE DELL (DRUMS)

1310 SUBTLE SEXTOLOGY

Back in July of '44 Red Norvo gathered up a sextet comprised of five rhythm and a clarinet. While not making any appreciable explosion in this "World of Atomic Evolution" they nevertheless did make some highly commendable Jazz. Subtle Sextology is a prime example. Wrapped up in typical Norvo subtlety, Wilson has the best solo in the package.

1314 THE MAN I LOVE SEVEN COME ELEVEN

Sachs and Wilson split the opening chorus of Man, Stewart taking the second. The remaining two go to Norvo at double tempo. And the "Redhead" really comes on. Showing more zest than ever before Norvo knocks off a stupendous solo. His taste, technique, and phrasing are unbeatable. This along with his swinging drive make for one of the best Norvo solos ever waxed. Man I love that Norvo, when he plays like this. On the backing Red is again in a mellow mood and happily it is contagious with the rest of the group. With Red sparking them and Eddie Dell throwing a steady beat, the Six give the "naturals" a fast roll.

1319 BLUES A LA RED

The boys couldn't have had the blues the day these four sides were waxed. Blues A La Red actually an up tempo riff has good solos by Wilson and Sachs.

1310 RUSSIAN LULLABY

Johnny Thompson did the scoring and it's one of those discs that take repeated listenings to convey the full beauty of his arranging. Solos are by d'Amico, Wilson, Thomas, and Norvo on xylophone. This is the record to put on the turntable for friends who insist Jazz is always loud and fast!

1319 I GOT RHYTHM

The Gershwin opus swings all the way due to the fine opening by Norvo's vibres backed by Powell's drums. Taken at medium tempo rather than the usual race horse speed the side is paced so that the solos are phrased WITH intelligence and WITHOUT rush. Everybody has one with Vic's break having lots of that old intestinal fortitude. The ensemble chorus show amazing originality.
