

LEONARD FEATHER

345 Lost Weekend Blues The Lady In Debt

No matter how much one disagrees with Leonard's Jazz opinions, one has to admit that most of his "pick up" sessions are above average when it comes to producing Jazz. This date, no exception by his BLUE SIX. features the humorous vocalizing of Clyde Bernhardt, Tab Smith's alto, Feather's piano and Joe Guy's trumpet. "B". a sequel to Feather's "LADY IN BED", is punched out at middle tempo. "A", a sequel to the picture of the same name is taken at the blues speed. It is of course also a Feather tune. Both sides a pleasant deviation from to-day's crop of killer-dillers.

DIZZY GILLESPIE

354 Lover Man

Shaw 'Nuff

LOVER MAN is honoured by the distinguished presence of the best girl vocalist in years-Sarah Vaughn. All that talk from the "streets" in regards to her is no baloney. This girl is it. Her phrasing is stupendous. What a side to put on the turntable with twilight descending. "Dizzy" has a solo spot for his horn, the arrangement is adequate, but the boys are just along for the ride. Miss Vaughn does all the steering. SHAW NUFF like MAN was recorded by "Diz" and his QUINTETTE. You couldn't get

a piece of tissue paper in between the unison blowing of Parker and Gillespie on this side. These two and Al Haig are the soloists. If you like "Re-bop" you'll like this. The tricky ending, ends all tricky endings.

399 Our Delight Good Dues Blues

These sides are by Gillespie's big band. On DELIGHT the wonderful reed section, Dizzy, and somebody's Thompson like tenor are spotted. The reverse is an average blues number sung by an average singer, Alice Roberts. The arranging however, is way above average. The "Diz" plays some very exciting horn on this side, even playing some "down to earth notes."

404.. One Bass Hit Part Two

John Birks stretched this two-sided single into a homer. What with the imaginative bass work of Ray Brown, the scholary soloing of Sonny Stitt's alto, and the maestro's fine horn on the first side. And more great Brown bass, echo chorus by horn, sax and trom and that truly wonderful reed section blowing some beautiful blended passages on the reverse. A great record by the SEXTET on Part One, and by the orchestra on Part Two. The whole composition is held together by terrific scoring and terrific interpretation of the score.

JOE MARSALA

329 Lover Don't Let It End

328 Gotta Be This Or That Southern Comfort

344 East Of The Sun Slightly Dizzy

These six sides by the JOE MARSALA SEPTET (Marsala, Joe Thomas, Adele Guaid, Charlie Queener, Chuck Kayne, Sid Weiss, and Buddy Christian) vary in style from the jumping COMFORT to the soothing SUN. LOVER, after a liquid beginning, has some fast jam by the two Joes, Wayne and Adele. END was formerly roorded by Marsala on 12 inch Black and White. This version suffers none whatsoever in its deletion. Thomas takes the mute out of his horn which finds him playing much better. THIS OR THAT, has a fair opening by Queener's piano, which is followed by the "leader's" vocal. He is backed in succession by Wayne, Thomas and Guaid. All three later soloing. The last chorus has some good light bash. COMFORT is very "easy listening" stuff. Marsala, backed by Queener and a fine beat, gets off a good chorus. Wayne and Guaid are the other soloists. The chamber music styled harp Adele plays on SUN, contrasts splendidly with her husband,s slightly rasped clarinet. Charlie Queener, the other soloist patterns his playing after Mrs. Marsalo's. SLIGHTLY DIZZY is more than so. Typical Gillespie material; it features its composer Chuck Wayne, the other Charlie, Sid Weiss and Adele. Only criticism of these records-not enough Joe Thomas.

ARTIE SHAW

357 Let's Walk Ghost of a Chance

409 The Hornet How Deep Is the Ocean

All four sides are pleasantly relaxed and styled by Shaw, but they will appeal more to the casual listener of Jazz rather than the devotee. They are ideal for dancing, holding little in the way of excitement for the collector. Sides two and four are sung by the dramatic Hal Stevens.

Just You is middle grooved, with the boss' tricky piano and Shaver's open horn being the starring attractions. The reverse features by far the best Charlie Shavers we have ever heard. Power finally combining with taste. Both Wilson's and Norvo's solos are similar to their work on Just A Mood And that's good. Not merely a good side—a great side. A lush atmosphere here prevails on Memories. When one listens to Wilson, one comes to the conclusion that one can't just appreciate all of his fine piano. It takes two to absorb it all. Ordinarily Norvo's solo would get him the "Cake", but with Teddy's dainty tinkling on tap, it's Wilson for this side. On the "flip-over" Norvo comes back to prove he can star on fast tempos as well as slow ones. Everybody takes one here, But "Red" must have been slated by the Gods for this "biscuit". His two spots show him poking out tremendous "drives". No session is quite complete without the playing of the lovely standard, I Surrender Dear. And as on most records of this type, if Norvo is on the date he usually takes top honours. He does on this, but he is still hard pressed by Wilson. Runnin' Wild has some very nice brush work by "Specs" Powell. On this side as well as a few of the others, Charlie Shavers gets in a lot of open work. Not normally a Shavvers fan, these sides I think display Charlie during some of his finest moments. Six sides with kicks aplenty for everybody.
