

RED SEAL RECORDS

BRASLAU, SOPHIE

64983 My Laddie Boy

Sophie Braslau's contribution to the Victor records this month is a "popular" song, in a style familiar to the world-at-large. It is sung throughout in a rich, powerful contralto, with altogether extraordinary clearness of tone and utterance. It is given dignity and beauty by the unusual distinction of its orRogers-Akst 10-in. list price \$1.25 chestral setting, in which a violin and a violoncello combine with the voice in tender and clinging counterstrains. These two instruments have an interlude of their own, duetting against the orchestral background, one and then the other gleaming forth in throbbing veins of tone color.

DE GOGORZA, EMILIO

64984 In the Shade of the Palm

The recent revival of "Florodora" has brought with it the demand that this song, one of the numbers that most contributed to its fame, should be recorded by an artist of the highest rank. And this charming, even inspired, record is the re-

Leslie Stuart 10-in. list price \$1.25 sult. Technically, it is a fine example of pure legato singing, note melting into note and phrase into phrase with exquisite liquid smoothness; emotionally, it takes place among the most beautiful baritone love songs of recent months.





ELMAN. MISCHA

64977 Hungarian Dance-No. 17 in F Sharp Minor

Brahms—Joachim 10-in, list price \$1.25

Johannes Brahms did not write all the Hungarian dances, great as were the series he left the world. Here is one by Josef Joachim, the great nineteenth-century violinist, and it is as "rich and strange" as anything ever inspired by the folk music of Hungary. Elman's tone throughout is powerful, sweet, and penetrantly disturbing. There are some beautiful passages in doublestops, two strings making melody.

GARRISON, MABEL

64978 The Nightingale and the Rose Saint-Saëns 10-in. list price \$1.25 (Song of the Nightingale from "Parysatis")

This melody is written in musical notation, but it is a bird-like strain nevertheless, and the notes are flung off with the ease and delight of the little winged singer, uplifting its euphony to the light of the full moon. It is mostly in brief, light

phrases, self-echoed very softly and distantly, and sometimes giving way to a descending chromatic scale as ethereal as the downward rush of some violin glissando. Harp tones, glittering like the "star streams of Eridanus," attend it.

GIGLI. BENIAMINO

64959 Iris—Apri la tua finestra (Open Thy Lattice Window)

This daintily beautiful serenade is a gleam of light in Mascagni's tragedy of Japanese life. The serenade is sung, in this, to the puppet heroine, by the puppet hero, concealed like any Punch-and-Judy showman. It is in waltz tempo, the third beat of each measure being omitted in the

harp accompaniment, and an odd, appropriate mechanical effect being produced—which extends, however, only to the instrumental part of the serenade, as it should. The key and the mode—major or minor—change from bar to bar. The spirit of minstrelsy prevails.



HOMER, MME. LOUISE

88640 Mother Goose Song

Having reared children of her own, Mme. Homer knows what she is doing when she records this charming little medley—the self-gratulation of Jack Horner, the entomological adventure of Miss Muffet, the nightly excursion of Wee Willie Winkie, the tragic tale (allegro

Sidney Homer 12-in. list price \$1.75 strepitoso) of Solomon Grundy, the history of the domicile that Jack built (stretto, presto furioso, quasi parlando), and one or two others. The record will delight both children and their elders. The music is by turns soft and cuddlesome, or wildly exciting.

JOHNSON, EDWARD

64985 The Want of You

Edward Johnson is one of those happy artists who possess both a voice and the gift of using it to express human emotion. The present song affords an example of this combination of power. It is in English, expressing in easily-fol-


MORINI, ERIKA

64979 Faust-Waltz (from New Fantasie)

The rhythm given by the piano, the violin enters at once upon a series of rushing, whirling, ascending eighth notes, topped off with a steely harmonic. The familiar eighth-note second theme of the waltz is split up into sixteenths, the tempo varying giddily but the spirit of the waltz, if anything, gaining thereby.

Gounod-Sarasate 10-in, list price \$1.25. The slower third theme is clearly outlined, but breaks off with each accent into another series of ascending passage, a little trill at the top of each. Then the first theme returns, in clangorous multiple stops, the effect being nearly that of solid chords in arpeggio. The climax is played with vigor.

No really great man but has a keen sense of humor. Debussy, most poetic of modern French composers, lost nothing of his dignity when he wrote the quaint but amusing "Children's Corner" suite from which this number is taken. "Golliwogg's Cake-Walk" is a graceful

Debussy 10-in. list price \$1.25 Gallic tribute to the Afro-American ceremonial dance that every American knows. It is fantastic but never grotesque, and picturesque without being savage. It has all the rhythm—the jerk and the shuffle of the dance—but it is a cake-walk seen through magic spectacles.

(King of Lahore—Oh, What Promise of a Joy Divine!)

Scindia, false minister to Alim, King of Lahore, who has been killed in battle, is now consumed with love for Sita, the king's bride, whom he has seized and carried off, and whom he later succeeds in making his own. This is the music of his love dream,

64986 Farandole (from L'Arlésienne Suite No. 2) Bizet 10-in. list price \$1.25

In this number it is not difficult to recognize the Bizet who wrote "Carmen," and who left in every bar of it an echo of some quaint Spanish or Provencal dance. Those who remember the prodigious adventures of Tartarin of Tarascon will recall how the "Tarasque," the

legendary griffin-grandmother of that joyous community, was yearly borne through the streets of the city, a giant paper dragon, surrounded by a guard of honor and followed by a populace dancing the Farandole. Bizet caught the spirit of this dance, and so has Toscanini.

WERRENRATH, REINALD

64987 There's Sunlight in Your Eyes Lewin-Harling 10-in. list price \$1.25

This song expresses, in music of an avowedly popular type, what it is every womanly woman's ambition to hear, not once but many times in the course of a life—the praise, by her lover, of her own particular charm, whatever it may be. In this case a woman's eyes have spoken

what her lips, perhaps, have been hesitant to avow; and answering lips, then, tell the story that is as old as humankind. The song is gentle and tender, and it is sung with the perfection of interpretative craft. Throughout there is a delicate and vivid play of counter-melody.

64954 El Relicario (The Charm)

The millions who have enjoyed the "Toreador Song" from Carmen will welcome this record of a song exceedingly similar in character and subject, if entirely different in melody, rhythm, and the essentials of music. It is a bull-fighter's songthe tale of an "espada" who has

Iose Padilla 10-in. list price \$1.25 missed his stroke and gone down beneath the rush of the maddened bull. The locket his true love has given him, the "relicario," flies forth from its place at his heart and is seen by her, a tiny golden speck on the sand, as she watches the tragedy high above.

DANCE RECORDS

18789 [In a Boat-Fox Trot 10-in. list price 85c. Sweetheart—Fox Trot

Here are two new fox trots in which the Whitemans introduce barbaric and modernist effects. "In a Boat' combines an odd series of chromatic melodies in continuous interplay. There are swift, abrupt modulations, fierce, "bitter" harmonies, and singular triplet cross-rhythms. "In a Boat" is by Arthur Lange, Licco Liggy and Ernest Klapholz. "Sweetheart" is by Arnold Johnson. Smooth and at times exquisite rhythmic figures glide out of an orchestral background shot through with many singular hues and patterns. Deep-voiced reed instruments are heard throughout, a more or less persistent eighth-note beat and several curious modulations engage the ear even while the feet are moving, and at the very

close there is an odd, fluttering loon call. These records are emphatically out of the usual run of things, even for Paul Whiteman's "outfit."

18797 Bring Back My Blushing Rose-Med. Fox Trot Shilking Orchestra 10-in. list price 85c. Stolen Kisses—Fox Trot

Fox trot records by two more new Victor organizations are extending the musical choice of the thousands now dancing who never danced before. "Bring Back My Blushing Rose" is notable for its clean, unfaltering, musicianly work as well as for the tempting beauty of its musical themes. No budding rose need blush at it—nor any drooping lily; wholesome, sane dance records like these make for physical health and good spirits. "Bring Back My Blushing Rose" from the "Ziegfeld Follies of 1921" is by Rudolf Friml, and it introduces "Sally, Won't You Come Back?" by Dave Stam-"Stolen Kisses" is by Ted Snyder. There is nothing furtive about these kisses—they go pop, pop in the middle of the record, and as only a xylophone is kissed by a

stick there is nothing to be shocked over. This is one of those records which make persons who "don't know one step from another" begin to prance anyhow. There is plenty of honest fun in these tunes for the long winter evenings at home or underneath a friendly roof. In hearing them, they bring back the old family belief, that if a child grew up uninstructed in its mothertongue, it would speak Hebrew. Modern authorities have thrown some doubt upon this, but they mostly agree that when a child sets out to dance by itself, it dances some of the marching, the prancing or the hopping steps which have distinguished the fox trot and the one step in the past, and which are giving them life and vigor today.

10-in. list price 85c. Bandana Days—One-Step

Eubie Blake and his Shuffle Along Orchestra furnish the newest dance sensation in their first Victor record. The orchestra is an organization of colored artists from the big show. "Shuffle Along," one of the successes of the New York season. "Baltimore Buzz" is described as a toddle; but it will dance to anything, from the original African dip to the "Cat's Paw." The orchestra must be heard; its tempo and rhythm are consummately fine. "Baltimore Buzz" is by Sissle and

18790[Ilo-Fox Trot 10-in. list price 85c. Mimi—Fox Trot

The All Star Trio-and their orchestra-have discovered a lovely fox trot in "Ilo." It has a bland, smooth, ingratiating melody for an instrument that sounds like a distant pipe in a desert-sweet, remote and mysterious. Such a tune will win its way straight into the heart of dancers. In the middle portion. xylophone effects are prominent. "Ilo" is by Johnny S. Black, one of the composers of "Dardanella,"

18788 A Baby In Love—Fox Trot 10-in. list price 85c. The Last Waltz—Medley Waltz

A "baby" in love is not a new proposition. But this fox trot is, for it is the first fox trot from the Hackel-Bergè Orchestra, which so far has made only waltzes. It is finely rhythmic, clear and flexible, and it will "dance well" to anything from a baby-class step to a Scandal Walk-the latest thing in the fox-trot. It is from "The Last Waltz" and is by Alfred Goodman and R. Benatzky. "The Last

> Blake, and introduces their "In Honeysuckle Time." "Bandana Days" is by the same composers, and it is some one-step. It introduces "I'm Just Wild About Harry." The first one-step the Victor Company has put out for several months, it is worth waiting for. It has beautiful sinuous melodies, played without harshness or stridency, and a rhythmic splendor and perfection attained in few dance compositionsor by few organizations. Here and there is just a suggestion of "Dixie."

Waltz" is also from "The Last Waltz." It is by Oscar Straus, and it introduces his "Roses Out of Reach" and "Now Fades My Golden Love Dream." It is played in a beautiful, steady tempo and a beautiful, finished style, with the clear, bright, flexible string tone the waltz, of all dances, seems most to call for. And dancers are as sensitive to things of this sort as musicians—and possibly more so.

"In a Monastery Garden" is one of those popular records which, by their freedom from flippancy or careless musical workmanship, and by their direct appeal to the deeper and sincerer feelings of humanity, deserve to stand beside the great musical classics. Its melody is slow, suave, majestic, full-harmonied, and through it are heard the carollings of birds and the solemn "Kyrie Eleison" of the brothers, the massive bells of the monastery booming

In recording, for the harp, the world-famous Fantasie Impromptu of Chopin, Alberto Salvi has not only achieved something far beyond the technical powers of most harpists, but he has added new beauty, if anything, to one of the most delicately beautiful of all Chopin's piano compositions. Soft melodies arise above a constantly-shifting arpeggio bass like the pallid forms of ghosts across the landscape of a summer night. Zigzag chromatic passages play here and there

forth above and around them. The Peerless Quartet sings the vocal chorus, reverently and with deep feeling. "In a Monastery Garden" is by Albert W. Ketèlbey. The "Romance" is one of Tschaikowsky's, and it is one of the most flexibly melodious of the great Russian master's compositions. It is like a slow, sinuous dance, chiefly in the minor key, but with those deft confusions of major and minor only possible to a master mind.

like lightning along the horizon, here and there mounting to the zenith, spanning the whole arc of the heavens and disappearing beyond. Nothing in recent years has been heard like this record. Parish-Alvars' "Fantasie" is in simpler harmonic style, but it is brilliant, however, beyond easy description. There are powerful sweeping arpeggi, snapping, clangorous chords, tremolo effects, not "coaxed" from the instrument, but struck forth by the hand of a master.


18792 College Days

This is a welcome record—two songs for memories. Many will recognize "College Days" as a memorial of the days when the "boys" took their liquor with the full sanction of the law. Even if the song was sung among clattering steins and flat beverages, its sentiments were strong, wholesome and masculine. Every man who bears a degree—and a lot who do not—will recog-

nize it. It is beautifully, even affectingly sung. "College Days," which is from "The Prince of Pilsen," is by Frank Pixley and Gustav Luders. "Auld Lang Syne" is the great friendship song of Englishspeaking peoples throughout the world. There is little need to remind these that the words were written by Robert Burns to an old Scottish tune.





N the passing away of Enrico Caruso, the modern world lost its greatest interpreter of vocal music. So great was that loss that it may be years,

perhaps, before the full depth of

it is known.

The name of Caruso is a part of the world's intellectual history the real history of mankind, not the long list of kings and potentates the world has been so painfully taught to consider the record of its

growth.

The most modern—possibly the most heartless—definition of immortality is, that so long as a man may be remembered, he is immortal. The creative artist, the composer, the poet, is remembered because the works are handed down in a form that makes them easy of recollection. His utterances are set down in books—in words, in musical notation, in a series of symbols that can be read by anyone trained to them.

But not until a few years since, the interpreter, the artist whose function it was to give sound to the creations of the composer or the poet, although he did not pass out of knowledge with death, was helpless to leave anything more than historic memory. The world today, if it could hear the voice of Cæsar, of the great Jewish lawgivers, of St. Paul-would greet their memories with more profound, more thrilling intimacy. For each, in his way, summed up for utterance, some common experience, some common aspiration of mankind.

Enrico Caruso is at least one world-interpreter whose actual utterances have been rescued from oblivion. The great singers who preceded him—all but a few of his own contemporaries—are nothing more than names, written large enough, perhaps, upon the scrolls of history, but nevertheless limited, so far as their presence goes, to what the imagination may conjure up regarding them.

Caruso is not a memory, he is a presence. Generations yet unborn will hear his great voice, and thrill in the hearing. They will catch every turn and change of his mighty accents; they will follow, with forever-new ears, the path of music he has opened before him. Wars and catastrophes may arise and pass away; but unless humanity itself perishes utterly, the echoes of his voice will not cease.

The history of any great man really begins only with his death. If he has waxed "great," and in the process lived only for himself, the terrible justice of Time ignores him. Inferior men spring up, are accounted great by one generation, and forgotten by the next. But if he has done anything, in the world of life, which has been worthy, if he has stood above his fellows by the nobility of his achievements, history searches him out, brings into light the possible obscurity of his life, and the result is immortality.

If any singer within memory has deserved this, it has been Enrico Caruso. His death came to him at the height of his powers—in the very prime of life, and at the crown of his career. To the last, he was planning for larger and finer things—not for himself, but for the world of which he made himself the cheerful and untiring servant.

"Where the Lazy Mississippi Flows" affords a Kline-and-Baker record (if we dare couple these names in such business-like terms) which is among the finest of recent waltz-song records. It is by Alexis Ffrench and Rollo De Freyne. "Pale Moon" is an American Indian love song, sung of course in English but based upon American Indian melodic forms. It is delicate, sad, strange and lovely. A flute introduces it, with an odd, lonely-sounding little chromatic

chestrated. "Who'll Dry Your Tears?" is by Joe Young, Sam M. Lewis and Harry Akst. "In the Heart of Dear Old Italy" is by Eugene West and Jack Glogau. It is Italy seen through East Side eyes, whatever their memories have been.

18794 Melon Time in Dixieland lo-in. list price 85c. Irish Home Sweet Home

Billy Murray and American Quartet Billy Murray—Monroe Silver

"Melon Time in Dixieland" is by Dave Ringle. "Irish Home Sweet Home" is by Harry Von Tilzer. Billy Murray (you remember) sang several months ago of his "Old New Jersey Home," and now he rings in Monroe Silver to sing of an ancestral Irish one. Milesian tunes are played

by a Yiddish band; differences of opinion lead to an insurrection. Monroe sings in Yiddish dialect, Billy in Irish, and the "Wearing of the Green" is sadly mixed up with "Hatikvoh" and "Mazzoltov" with "Killarney." This is a highly original humorous record.

Musicians are hopeless to explain the peculiar magic of the waltz, played or sung. Lucy Marsh's first offering this month is a well-known and charming waltz song, one of the finest of its class—brilliant, not too heavy, with a series of melodies —really a "set" of vocal waltzes. There are brilliant echoed notes, scales and roulades, taken with consummate skill. "Spring's Awakening" is by Maude Cunningham and Wilfrid Sanderson. "The Nightingale" is Alabieff's famous song.

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
