Chemet has made a beautiful record of the rondo she played at the Victor broadcast concert on February 12,—swift, impetuous, scintillating with life. All the resources of the violin are called into play. With it are coupled, on the other side, a beautiful broad, majestic adagio from a Handel sonata, and an allegro of almost Olympian jollity, somewhat in the rhythm of the classical rigadoon. Both numbers are played with amazing spirit—and with that unconscious completeness and perfection of style which is the mark of greatness in the technical side of an art.

The confession of Gilda, to herself, of her secret love for the dissolute Duke of Mantua, and the similar if less serious confession of Rosina in the Barber of Seville. They are sung with superb and electrifying power—high B's and C sharps appear in them as naturally as middle tones of the voice. They illustrate, admirably, how varied a medium of expression the coloratura style in music can be—with a "serious" aria in the one instance and a sprightly one in its companion. The individual styles of the composers, too, are powerfully marked.

The first suggests the dance most of us know as the tango; the second is in the style of the Fox Trot Hesitation. "Amapola" yields some remarkable contrasts between the upper and lower tones of this unusual voice, and "Bimba" the singer's deft sense of rhythm. The orchestra's accompaniments are notable,—sustaining and vivifying the melodies of the voice with a marvelous play of coloring,—and always with the finest and subtlest rhythmic feeling.

Beethoven's Fifth symphony is perhaps the greatest of all works of abstract music—music free of literary, dramatic or religious connotations. A hundred years' slow absorption of its grandeur has made it in the highest sense a popular work today. This first movement is based wholly on the four-note theme at the beginning, of which Beethoven himself said, "Thus Fate Knocks at the Portal." It is nobly played, with full appreciation of its majestic power, its melodies taking form, bar by bar, from the simplest of all possible themes.

In these two great operatic numbers, Miss Ponselle displays her versatility to a remarkable degree, for they demand the lyric, the dramatic and the coloratura styles. "Suicidio" is in the large, dramatic mode, with high notes of ringing clarity, tender melody and at the end a deep 'cello-like note of great beauty. Miss Ponselle with her fine dramatic sense makes La Gioconda live again in all her passionate intensity. "Lulled in My Arms," requiring coloratura skill of high order, is full of ingratiating melody, with delicate embellishments including a flute and voice duet.

Two beautiful examples of the music of the Roman church at its highest development, presented with the traditional art of the Sistine Choir. The "Ave Maria" employs the famous male sopranos. "O Salutaris" breathes an atmosphere of deep devotion. It is worthy of note that crescendo and diminuendo are accomplished by adding to or subtracting from the number of voices, but with such skill that it is difficult to detect the point at which these join or become silent.

The glory of the Russian ballet-of the whole Imperial Court in its last great days-seems to cling like a perfume in these two numbers. They have been danced by the greatest dancers in the world, precisely as great operatic and concert music has been played or sung by the skilfullest expositors of the human voice or of musical instruments. The first is Russian-Oriental, the second Spanish, in style. If you like the music of "Carmen" or things like Moskowski's "Malagueña," you will want this record too. The Toreador and the Andalusian Maid (Toreador et Andalusse) is from Rubinstein's famous suite, "The Costume Ball," while the opera Feramors, from which the "Wedding Procession" derives, was based on Thomas Moore's poem of Lalla Rookh. These are "scenic" musical compositions, with all the glamour of the stage upon them. Interpretative dancers will receive them with especial delight.

There are many persons who think the refrain from Victor Herbert's "Kiss Me Again" is the most beautiful waltz melody ever composed in the United States. As we cannot think of a tenderer one, we never argue the point. We have been asked for a saxophone record of it, and here it is, by an artist who can exploit to the utmost the capabilities of that instrument. With it is a brilliant waltz of his own composing. The accompaniment is for the piano. It would be difficult to find a record more characteristic

of good saxophone playing today.

First Victor record by this distinguished young pianist, who at six years gave a public concert and was tendered a scholarship in the great historic conservatory at Leipzig. He is playing for us two of the most delightful salon-pieces of Cecile Chaminade—the delicate and elusive "Flatterer" and the graceful "Scarf Dance." Though both numbers are known to pianists and student pianists the world over, it takes an artist-reading like this to reveal their full beauty.





New "movie" effects, new tone colors in these records by Jesse Crawford played on the Wurlitzer Organ. No wonder there is such a demand for them. Mr. Crawford gets a lot of original tricks and effects. With the vast resources of the modern organ at his finger tips, the opportunity is offered for his imagination to invest familiar tunes with unsuspected embellishments, and he imitates the saxophone, 'cello and other instruments, not to mention using the celesta and orchestral bell and vox humana, giving always his own distinctive interpretation to this popular music. The records, we are certain will be in wide demand.

They are a perfect blaze of orchestral color, and daring dancers will take especial delight in them. They are smooth as a mill-race, absolutely without bumpiness, and here and there (note the pauses in Katharina) there is a breath-taking bit of technique.

is very convincing. The accompaniment to this song is splendidly done. Then Wendell Hall, the irresistible, has a turn, with one of his own vigorous songs with ukulele and guitar; there is a chuckle in every line. Both of these numbers are the timeliest imaginable.

They have been in demand a long time, and they will eagerly be welcomed. Thousands of church choirs have studied and sung the "Crucifixion," many of them without the chance of hearing really fine interpretations of the work. These records will help.

They are sung to the orchestra, and the plaintive melody of "Come Back to Erin" is in fine contrast with the bold, swinging one of "Killarney." Could anyone more appropriately sing these songs than a quartet bearing such a name as our familiar friends the Shannons?

A VICTOR ALBUM OF THE "PATHETIC" SYMPHONY

AFTER many, many requests from lovers of music, we at last are glad to announce that we have added to the Music Arts Library of Victor Records, a complete recording of the great B minor symphony of Tschaikowsky, the world-beloved "Pathetic" symphony, perhaps the

crowning example of Russian genius in musical composition.

This symphony, the closing work of the composer's life, written a little time before his death of the plague in Russia, seems to be, with possibly the single exception of Beethoven's Fifth Symphony, the most popular symphonic work in the world. Its melodies are of poignant and heart-searching character, its harmonies original and multifarious, and its rhythms instinct with the very pulse of life. They contain many things of unique interest—the marvelous lyric-tragic first movement, the unique second one in 5/4 time, the intricate scherzo, the sombre and magnificent close—these are charged with beauty.

The symphony is contained on five double-faced twelve-inch records made by the Royal Albert Hall Orchestra under the baton of Sir Landon Ronald. The list price of the records is \$8.00, which includes also the album in which they are contained. An interpretative description of the symphony, in English, is presented in the album, printed on the record

envelopes, with no danger of becoming lost or mislaid.

This issue is made in avowed accord with a principle which the Victor Company has upheld during the whole generation of its growth—that of giving to the music-loving world the great masterpieces of musical art in such form that they not only may reach the thousands who may never hear them on the concert stage, but that they may remain with them as treasured possessions—possessions to expand and dignify life itself.
