

A lyric soprano of unparalleled brilliance and sensitivity, Licia Albanese, whose debut at the Metropolitan can only be called sensational, sings magnificently the difficult first Act aria "Ah! fors' è lui" and "Sempre Libera" from Verdi's great opera La Traviata. Albanese's Violetta at the Met. was tremendously successful; her projection of Violetta on RCA Victor records ranks with the best in operatic recordings. Completely satisfactory is the Victor Orchestra's accompaniment under the distinguished Frieder Weissmann.

Popular swing ballad . . . easy-to-take harmony. Reverse . . . Hillbilly number . . . good listening and dancing.

All instrumental . . . swing from start to finish. "B" side jumping rhythm . . . real swing music . . . also instrumental.

Beautiful phrasing and melodious. Herbie does vocal honours. Reverse "Herbie's Original" . . . superb instrumental solos. Sweet Clarinet by Maestro.

A ditty with amusing lyrics . . . sung by practically everybody in the ork. Tother side a well-known song . . . everybody will want to sing it.

Slow ballads with voices blending in harmony. Don Cornell and the Three Kaydets on "A" vocal. On t'other side tempo picks up, double timing on second chorus.

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
